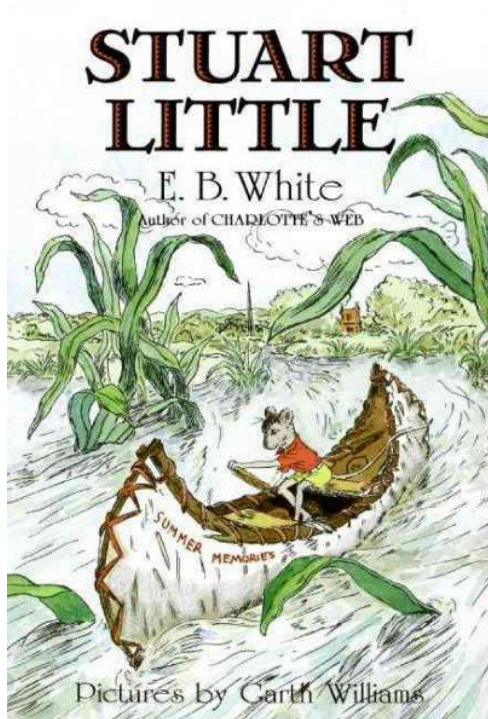


# Book Review
